The Italian Society of Neurology (SIN) was founded in 1907 and its mission is to promote the study of Neurology in Italy, with a view to fostering scientific research, training, specialist updating and to improving the professional quality of care delivered to patients with neurological diseases. SIN is a society of public and private specialists in Neurology, working in community, hospital and university settings.

SIN's 3000 members make it the largest association of neurologists in Italy and its training activities are regularly and constantly on the increase.

The Society's training and updating activities are designed to enhance care activities, promote research studies into nervous system diseases and to work alongside patient associations. Much research work is recognised at the highest international levels, contributing to the prestige of the Italian neurological community.

SIN's official journal, Neurological Sciences, has a 2016 impact factor close to 2 and is among the leading European scientific journals in the field. It is also equipped with a tele-training platform ([www.fadsin.it](http://www.fadsin.it)) to exploit the infinite potential of long-distance training and the many educational activities that derive from this. The tool is also designed to give members access to the wealth of scientific material accumulated over many years' experience in Continuing Education in Medicine (ECM) training. All structured events are awarded ECM credits, in accordance with the related regulations.

Since 12 March, 2007, the Italian Society of Neurology has been registered under no. 132 of the Registry of Recognized Legal Entities.

SIN is a not-for-profit entity and has no trade union purposes.

For its training activities the Society has been awarded the following certifications: ENI EN ISO9000:2001 with certificate no. 10731 dated 11/10/2006 and confirmed on 29/09/2009. The SIN Foundation is currently in the final stages of establishment, while the SIN Study Centre is already fully operational. Choosing Rome as the venue for your Congress will surely qualify participants from all over the world to a truly unique professional and personal experience.






# Roma for WCN




## Reaching Rome by Train, by airplane, by ship or by car

The major airport system in Italy consists of two airports Fiumicino – “Leonardo Da Vinci” and “Ciampino – Giovan Battista Pastine”.

**1,537,907** passengers, including landing and boarding figures  
plus **2,271,652** cruise passengers, in 2016  
**24** shipping companies  
**300** shipping lines towards the main national European and intercontinental destinations.

In 2016 Rome airport system welcomed **over 47 million** passengers with **over 230** destinations worldwide that can be reached from Rome, thanks to around **100** airlines operating at both airports.

**850** trains per day  
**140,000** passages per day and about  
**51 million** passengers per year. It is served by all the long-distance northwards and southwards trains not ending in Roma Termini Station.


