Regional Teaching Courses




- Aim: specially designed for the purpose to bring teaching of excellence about neurological standards directly to the

- Content: basic teaching in neurology

- Course profile: in English; 3 days duration; handout is provided
- Morning: one plenary session with four speakers (app. 50 minutes each speaker) covering three main topics
- Afternoon: small groups (case-based videoclips, hands-on course, workshops)










Clinical Fellowship 2020





Important! Find your hosting department before application to EAN! as you need a letter of acceptance from the host department, including a named supervisor

Purpose (subject in negotiation)

- -Provide a well- defined clinical observational experience at a hosting department outside the country of residence
- 6 weeks with a minimum of frequency of 5 days/week
- -neurologists in training or recently qualified & setting up a new service / practice can learn from observing the usual practice in the hosting department, including any or all of clinical practice, service structures or specific techniques conducted.

<u>Award</u>

- -35 grants
- -2250 Euro (1500/month)
- -travel expenses of up to **300 Euro**
- -Total: **2550 Euro**

Application deadline: 31.08.2019


Eligibility

- residents of neurology with a minimum of 2 years training or completed training within the last 3 years at the time of application.
- accepted by an approved host department (list on www.ean.org)
- EAN full or RRFS member



Research Fellowship 2020





Important! Find your hosting department before application to EAN! as you need a letter of acceptance from the host department, including a named supervisor

Research training fellowship (typical 12 months, > 6 months) [2018: 5]

• Aim: lead either to completion of a higher degree, a grant application or peer-reviewed publication

Research experience fellowship (typical 6 months, < 6 months) [2018: 2]

- Aim: to gain high quality research experience in individuals who might otherwise not have the opportunity but who may wish to pursue a research career.
- to obtain training in a specific research methodology or technique (not currently available in their own country and of clear value to home department) of experienced clinicians/researchers

Award: € 2,000 per month (plus travel expenses of up to € 500)

<u>Eligibility:</u> residents of neurology (with a minimum of 2 years training) or certified clinical neurologist (with up to a maximum of 5 years beyond their final degree)

Application deadline: 31.08.2019







- ✓ Eligible are PhD (neurology) students, residents of neurology or certified clinical neurologists (with no more than 3 years practice since completing training) who are working in Europe and whose abstract has been accepted.
- ✓ It is also possible for colleagues in training from Algeria, Egypt, Jordan, Kyrgyzstan, Lebanon, Libya, Morocco, Palestine, Tunisia and Syria as well as from sub-Saharan countries belonging to the HINARI Group A list of countries as established by WHO (www.who.int/hinari/eligibility/en/) to apply for bursaries.

EBN exam



- Structured examination helps to harmonize the postgraduate training of Neurologists and sets European standards
- Close to national examination
- High pass rate
- Test own knowledge in comparison to Neurologists from different countries
- Leads to a qualification (FEBN)
- Is an additional sign of excellence but no legal consequence is attached nor the right to practise within the EU or elsewhere is affected.



EAN-RRFS TRAVEL GRANTS

- 4 travel grants

- Amount : **250** Euro

Eligible:

- ✓ trainees who have successfully presented their work at a conference during the
 year 2019
- ✓ or attended a course which significantly improved their clinical or research skills
- √ have not received any other financial support

Apply: motivation letter, your CV, approval of the participation of the congress/course, declaration stating that you have not received any other financial support.


